



# CLI C1 Syllabus

# C1 level English is divided into two courses at CLI:

## C1.1 & C1.2.

## C1.1

The C1.1 level English CLI course has a duration of 60 hours, consisting of two lessons per week with each lesson lasting two hours.

Students must attend 80% of the C1.1 course in order to get a certificate of attendance and must pass the final test with at least 60% to gain a pass certificate and be eligible for the C1.2 course.

The final test is divided into the following parts:

Listening, Reading, Grammar and Vocabulary, Writing and Speaking. Speaking may be valued during the course and not as a part of the final test.

The syllabus covered in the C1.1 English at CLI/Unipi course includes the following:

## C1.2

The C1.2 level English CLI course has a duration of 60 hours, consisting of two lessons per week with each lesson lasting two hours.

Students must attend 80% of the C1.2 course in order to get a certificate of attendance and must pass the final test with at least 60% to gain a level certificate.

The final test is divided into the following parts:

Listening, Reading, Grammar and Vocabulary, Writing and Speaking

The syllabus covered in the C1.2 English at CLI/Unipi course includes the following:

#### **Vocabulary topics**

- Compound adjectives
- Phones and technology
- ➤ Adjectives + prepositions
- Word formation: prefixes
- > Art, illustration and colour idioms
- ➤ Health and medication
- Similes
- Travel and tourism
- Animals and insects
- ➤ Food
- Word building: adjectives, nouns and verbs
- Words that are often confused

#### **Grammar topics:**

- Verb + object + infinitive or gerund
- Conditional sentences
- > Permission, obligation and necessity
- > Perception and sensation
- Advanced gerunds and infinitives
- > Future plans and arrangements
- ➤ Ellipsis
- Nouns: compound and possessive forms
- Relative clauses
- > Cleft sentences

#### Objectives and competences

Upon completion of both the C1.1 and the C1.2 courses and in accordance with the CEFR description of C1, students should be able to:

- 1. Understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts, and recognise implicit meaning.
- 2. Express him/herself fluently and spontaneously without much obvious searching for expressions.
- 3. Produce clear, well-structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organisational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.
